As a graduate, you will have the capacity to increase your professional mobility and apply global perspectives to your local professional setting.

CSU's Master of International Education (School Leadership):

- is offered in Ontario under the written consent of the Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities
- is administered through our Bathurst Campus in New South Wales, Australia
- has been developed and updated in partnership with the Catholic Principals' Council Ontario (CPCO) and Ontario Principals' Council (OPC)
- is a 10 course program in which you can receive credit for up to five courses in prior learning credit
- courses are focused on leadership, international education, and educational issues globally and locally.

Recognition of prior learning

CPCO provides the PQP 1 and 2 Standard and at a Masters Dimension level for aspiring and practising leaders. These courses have clearly articulated credit arrangements into CSU's Master of International Education (School Leadership).

CSU will provide credit for professional learning undertaken by teachers upon application and during Masters-level study in the Master of International Education (School Leadership).

Prior learning credit is available for the PQP Parts 1 and 2 standard and the PQP Parts 1 and 2 with a Masters Dimension. CSU will also provide credit for Schedule D three-part additional qualifications as approved and cited by the Ontario College of Teachers.
